5. COVID-19 preparation

a. Help EMD as requested

Kevin said one reason for the mailing of cards with emergency contact information is to serve those with out internet access. All our other outreach is electronic.

Kevin said a food distribution at Bromley Mountain parking lot will take place on Tuesday, May 19. It will include 2 gallons of milk, Cabot butter and cheese, vegetables, frozen chicken plus box meals. The fresh food is locally sourced. The state is buying it and the Vermont Flood Band and the state National Guard is handling logistics with help from the state Emergency Operation Center.

He expects 1000 cars. Kevin will pick up for 16 people living at Smith Haven. He said there are no qualifications. Bruce noted that it is a lot of food to store. Kevin and Marge said excess could go the the Food Pantry and local restaurants such as Mike and Tammy's.

Kevin said someone has tested positive who is a patient at Grace Cottage Hospital who has done a lot of yard work in the area. Marge said she sees a lot of people out and about without masks.

Kevin said the Farmer's Market will open with an operating plan that includes use of masks by vendors and customers. There is room for 22 vendors with 12 feet between

each vendor. Runners will also be available for those who do not want to leave their vehicles.

Kevin said there are no masks on hand at the town clerk's office, but the rescue squad has 100 masks available for essential businesses. He said several people are making large quantities of masks. He said sanitizer is now available, so he will not make another purchase for the town.

Bruce said this program is still on hold. Kevin said perhaps students at BBA can make window inserts. Marge said the more we involve kids, the better.
